1 1/4 cup green pepper – puree

1 cup onions – puree

2 large cloves garlic – minced

1 tablespoon mustard seed

1/2 tablespoon celery seed

1 dried chilies

3/4 cup molasses

3/4 cup vinegar

1/3 cup worcestershire sauce

2 tablespoon chili powder

2 teaspoon ground black pepper

Wash skin and puree tomatoes bring to a boil and cook until reduced by half.

Add pureed peppers and onions garlic mustard and celery seed and dried chili.

Return to boil and cook for 10 minutes.

Add remaining 5 ingredients and cook for about 45 minutes or until it starts to thicken.

Ladle into sterilized jars and seal

1/3 cup lime juice

1 pouch of liquid pectin

1/4 cup rum or orange juice can be substitute for the rum

Wash, hull and crush strawberries.

Combine crush strawberries pineapple lime juices, add sugar and whisk until dissolved.

Stirring frequently, bring mixture to a boil ,remove from heat and add the rum or orange which ever you are using.

Stir in pectin. Cook for 5 minutes.

Remove from heat. Skim foam. Ladle into hot sterilized jars.

- 4 cups finely chopped peeled peaches

- 1 to 1/2 teaspoons cumin

Bring to full rolling boil on high heat stirring constantly still in remaining sugar 3 1/2 cup return to full boil and boil 1 min remove from heat stir and skim off the foam for 5 mins to prevent the fruit from floating.

In a microwave or heavy saucepan, melt butter and chocolate; stir until smooth. Cool slightly. In a bowl, beat eggs and sugar; stir in vanilla and chocolate mixture. Stir in flour until well blended. Pour into a greased 13 in. x 9 in. x 2 in. baking pan; set aside.

For topping, in a saucepan, combine brown sugar and butter. Cook and stir over low heat until butter is melted. Stir in the eggs, flour and vanilla until well blended. Stir in nuts. Spread

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evenly over brownie batter. Bake at 350°F for 40-45 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the centre comes out with moist crumbs (do no overbake). Cool completely on a wire rack. Yield: 1-1/2 dozen.

2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

1 1/2 cups milk chocolate chips

2 cans condensed milk

Preheat oven to 350°F. Butter the bottom and sides of a 9" x 13" baking dish. Line with parchment paper, overlapping the 2 longer sides for easy removal.

Base: In a large bowl add toasted coconut, oats and sugar.

Toss to combine. Pour in butter and stir to combine. Press the crust into an even layer on the bottom and up the sides of the prepared dish. Bake in preheated oven 18-20 minutes until

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golden brown.

Topping: Sprinkle nuts over the warmed crust. Cover nuts with chocolate chips. Pour sweetened condensed milk evenly over the filling.

Return to oven and bake for 30-35 minutes, until golden brown and bubbly. Cool in refrigerator until cold, about 4 hours or overnight before cutting into squares.

- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Hand/Machine Quilted Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making entry into the OAAS Hand/Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Hand/Machine Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- G. Machine-Quilted Quilt must have visible machine quilting.
